



## TECTONICS!

Continents are rock rafts floating on magma. Oceanic rocks are conveyor belts moving from upwelling magma (rising) to places where it sinks.

The movement of tectonic plates causes earthquakes, tsunamis, volcanoes, and mountain building. The rocks in western New York were formed in the ocean 350 million years ago then lifted up by tectonic forces about 300 million years ago.
