

We are working on Kepler's Law of Planetary Motion in math. Kepler's first law is all planets move in ellipses, a squashed circle shape (above). We used Astronomical Units (AU) for finding the planet's distance from the sun as to demonstrate Kepler's third law, the mathematical relationship between planets. 1 AU is the distance between the sun and the Earth. Mars is 1.1881 AU which is .1881 farther than Earth from the sun.
