

In Earth Science we have been working on Ice Cores. Ice Cores are layers of snow that get pressed down over years and years making ice. Scientists are drilling into the ice for sometimes miles to get the cylinder of ice to pull out and observe it

On the Ice Core one layer might have dirt, dust, elements of the seasons, etc.

Scientists are also using them for multiple things like predicting future weather and seeing if there is a pattern. They are using them for climate change and how humans are making it go up much faster due to all of the CO2 (carbon dioxide) in the air. By the way, it has gone up more than it has in the past 100,000 years! Scientists are also using them for finding out when a volcano erupted, and measuring the methane and CO2 in the air at a specific time.

Did you know that the oldest constant Ice Core is 800,000 years old?




Hudson Valley Project By Ria
