

Student of the Week




If you borrow money from the bank you have to pay interest, which is a percentage of the money that you took out that is added on. The longer it takes to pay off a loan the more you end up paying.

Your money can grow with compound interest if you put it in a savings account or invest it. If you invest \$100 and a company is going to give you 7% a year. You would have \$107 at the end of year. Now you would take 7% of \$107. Your money starts to grow faster. Sometimes it is compounded more than once a year.

The formula for compound interest is $A = P(1 + \frac{r}{n})^{nt}$

A = the total amount you have

P = initial investment (principle)

1 = 100% of the current amount

r = rate (% added on)

n = number of times compounded per year

t = time in years
