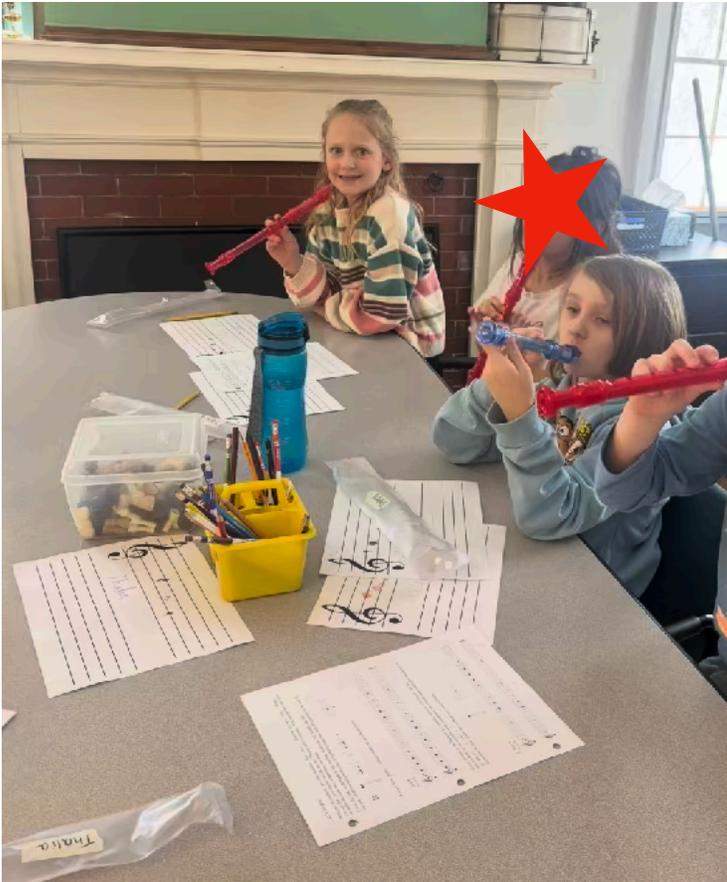


Mandala School Newsletter

Student of the Week: Amelia

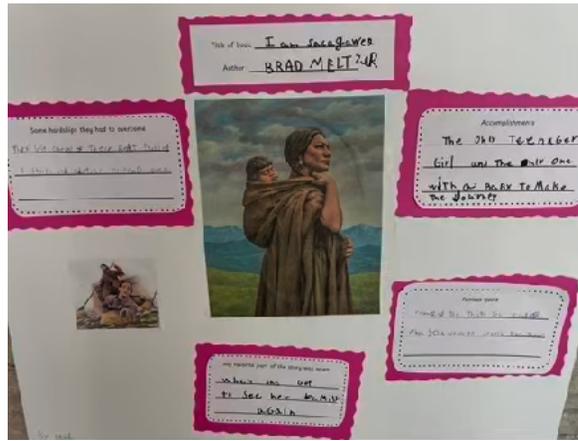
Amelia is really kind and really funny. She is fun to play with! She has many beautiful singing voices and she is a fantastic piano player. She is great at drawing and math, too!

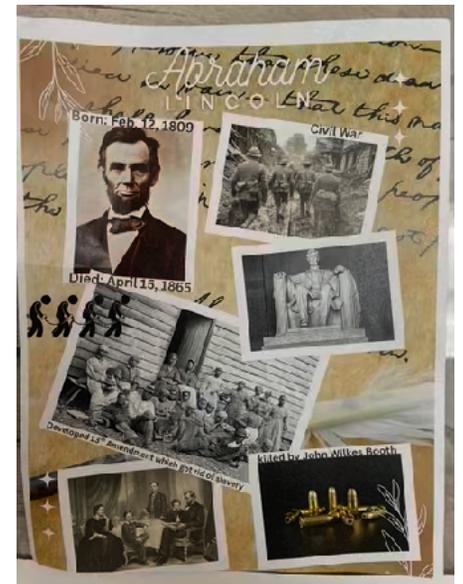
