
Donato Bramante, was an architect who introduced the High Renaissance style in architecture. His notable works include the rectory of Sant' Ambrogio which he heaped on and the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie in Milan. In Rome, he was the principal planner for Pope Julius II's rebuilding project, and he served as chief architect of St. Peter's Basilica, begun in 1506. 

Owen patching the wall




